In August your Sidney Emmaus Board will begin the process of searching for new board members for terms that will begin January 1, 2021

- All positions are two-year terms with the exception of Vice Chairman, which is a three-year commitment.
- All board members are expected to attend monthly board meeting, which are held on the 4th Thursday of each month.

The following board positions, along with a brief description of some of the duties of that position, will be voted on at October's Gathering.

- Music Chair The music chair serves the community by coordinating music for all monthly Gathering, including the October All-Music Gathering. The music chair also supports walk weekend music directors, maintains all music supplies (song books, CD players, etc.) and takes care of all CCLI reporting when necessary.
- Men's Registrar Chair The registrar chair duties include filings applications as they are received. They are responsible for collecting fees from the pilgrims, working with the Treasurer to get the funds deposited. As the walk weekends approach the registrar contact perspective pilgrims to invited them to attend the walk weekend. They pass on the pilgrims list to the Sponsorship Chair, Agape Chair, website person, name tag person, etc. and Lay Director of the weekend. On Thursday of a walk weekend, the registrar welcomes the pilgrims, collects any remaining fees, and explains the basic weekend process and flow to the pilgrims.
- Newsletter Chair The position of the Newsletter Chair is to create and publish the El Quiri Newsletter for the Sidney Area Emmaus members. The purpose of the newsletter is to get Emmaus events, news, and information out to people who have attended an Emmaus weekend. Newsletters are usually released three times per year, right before each set of walks. Articles for the Newsletter are requested from other board members, as well as the most recent Lay Directors. Upcoming teams and new members of the community are also included. The Newsletter is currently posted on the Emmaus Facebook page and <a href="https://www.sidneyemmaus.org">www.sidneyemmaus.org</a> for people to view. The Newsletter Chair also works with Outreach Chair to e-mail the newsletters to community members in the database.
- **Literature Chair** Two weeks prior to walks, gather book list from team and send to book store, pick up books, set up book table for walk weekends, collect monies from sales of walk weekend at closing, and return unsold books to store on Monday. Repair loose pages in team manuals as needed and insert changes and updates (new board member list etc). Copy and put together pilgrim packets for the walks. Order all the literature that goes in packets when needed and order Chi Rho crosses when needed.

- **Agape Chair** Print other community agape letters that are shared on the weekends and send out our agape letter to other communities. Print out the 24-hour prayer vigil and distribute it at Gathers for sign up. Sort out agape for team and pilgrims on walk weekends. Organize and solicit table and bed time agape. Set up and take down Agape room on walk weekends.
- **Supplies Chair** The duties of the Supply Chair is to maintain an inventory of supplies used for each weekend ink pens, binders, paper, votive candles given to each pilgrim, etc. They are also responsible for purchasing items for the "table of forgotten." They also assist other board members in ordering they materials they need to do their jobs. They are responsible for getting all invoices to the community treasurer.
- Worship Chair Recruit and schedule Fourth Day speakers for each Gathering. Set up Holy Communion for Gatherings and for the monthly board meeting. Clean up any Communion crumbs after Gathers, board meetings, and Sunday closings on walk weekends.
- Treasurer Chair The Treasurer position is responsible for collecting all money for the community and depositing it at the bank, picking up the bills at the church office and paying them in a timely manner. This person should attend all monthly Gatherings, send offs, Candle Lights, Closings, monthly Board Meetings and quarterly Exec. Board Meetings. The Treasurer is to provide a monthly Treasurers report to the Chairman prior to the monthly Board meetings so it can be copied and distributed for review at the meetings.
- Men's Good Shepherd Chair Aggressively promote, register, and maintain records of active share groups by towns, locations, and meeting places. Make your position as good shepherd known to the community by attending Gatherings, candlelight services, send offs, etc. You need to be able to talk to people, asking if they are in a share group, or if they need help getting into one. Attend closings of men's walks; this helps new members know who you are. Use social media (like Emmaus's Facebook page and email) to reach out and contact people for share group connections.
- **Kitchen Coordinator Chair** This position includes shopping for the food for all meals served on Emmaus weekends, coordinating menus for each meal, and preparing for any special diet restrictions. This role is also responsible for scheduling and overseeing a team of workers in the kitchen who cook, serve and clean up after each meal during the walk weekend. There are two teams of Kitchen Coordinators who rotate this responsibility on alternating walks.
- Vice Chair The Vice Chair is a three-year commitment. The first you year serve on the board you are the Vice Chair and your duties include hosting the monthly Gatherings. For your three years on board you are also part of the Executive Board and are required to attend Executive Board meetings when scheduled. The second year you move up to Chairman and your duties include running the monthly board meetings, trouble shooting community issues, assisting other board members with their duties, chairing Executive Board meetings, representing the community at walk send off and closing services. Your third year on board your move up to the Leadership position. Your duties include compiling ballots for lay director votes at board meetings, attending Emmaus activities, trouble shooting issues, and assisting other board members with duties. This position requires an extensive working knowledge of the Sidney Emmaus Community and is usually filled by someone who is a past Lay Director and has previously served on the Emmaus Board.

### SERVING IN THE KITCHEN

#### **NEW Kitchen Sign Up**

We are testing out a new, online kitchen crew sign up process. This online site will allow everyone the opportunity to sign up to serve and cook in the kitchen during the Walk weekends. There are a couple of ways to signup.

- 1. There is a link on the Emmaus Facebook page that will take you to the signup web site.

- 4. There will also be a manual sign up sheet at the monthly gatherings.

#### Some features of the new sign up process:

- 1. Allows you to sign up yourself and also sign up others (friends and family)
- 2. Provides everyone a view of the spots that are open and still need willing servants. (Note even if all spots are filled, you are welcome to join the kitchen crew and lend an extra hand).
- 3. Allows everyone to remove themselves from a spot if he/she is not longer able to serve.
- 4. If you enter your email address, you will receive a reminder email 7 days before your time to serve. (Note their privacy policy states they will NOT sell your email address to other marketers).

Hello Emmaus Community,

Just a few reminders as we kick off this Emmaus weekend:

- 1. If you have bedtime Agape, there needs to be 60 pieces if it is for all. If you want it to be pilgrim bedtime, there needs to be 30. \*\*Please mark as bedtime Agape or let us know when dropping off. \*\*
- 2. Meal Agape should have 60 pieces. \*\*Please mark meal time Agape or let us know when dropping off.\*\*

  (\*\*We have been short on bedtime and meal time, lately. Could your share group help? Do you have a Bible Study you meet with that could help?)
- 3. NO MEGA AGAPE!! What is considered Mega Agape? Anything larger than an envelope is considered mega agape. While we all know it is nice to receive these, please save for after the walk when your pilgrim is picked up on Sunday. We need to make sure that whatever is given to pilgrims, fits in their envelope packet on Sunday. (This includes for team also. If you want to do gift bags for team, please deliver them on your own as it makes more work for your logs who are passing out the bedtime agape to try to deliver these as well and we all know the LOGS (LEGS) work hard enough (©)
- 4. Please make sure all pilgrim agape is marked with first and last name and adding "pilgrim" helps also. Please try to make sure there is no Agape marked, "mom", "dad", "Aunt Sally", etc. as we are not always sure who it belongs to with those markings and we want to make sure it gets to the right person.
- 5. PILGRIMS RECEIVE NO PERSONAL AGAPE EXCEPT ON SUNDAY IN THEIR PACKET!!
- 6. If agape is for team, please put first and last name and "team" on envelope. If it is for team that is giving a talk, please write "talk agape" on the envelope and we will make sure it gets in the right spot. Also, on that note, if you want them to have it a specific evening, please indicate that on the envelope as well. If you have Agape for the spiritual directors, please mark them. If they are not a live in, we have a hard time getting their agape to them after their talk, so please bring in before their talk.
- 7. There are baskets in the Agape room that are labeled for Agape. Please make sure to use the baskets and please do not go behind table. This can confuse things for those working in the agape room.
- 8. If you have brought in table or bedtime Agape, please come to the Agape room and check to see if you have extras. We are unable to use it for other walks if there is not enough. You can come and get your bag or box and make more for the next walk. If you bring in special bag and want it saved, please let us know or mark it so we can make sure it gets to the correct person.
- 9. There are cards, bookmarks and writing utensils available in the Agape room if you are needing to write Agape during the weekend. We ask that if you are writing Agape, please drop in the correct basket when you are finished and please put pens and unused things back in basket they were provided in.
- 10. If you are sponsoring a pilgrim, make sure to get their Agape packets from the Gathering Place after closings. If it is left, we will put out at gatherings or on walk weekends.
